

AuditMaster - Release Notes

General Release - March 2018

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Welcome

Thank you for your interest in AuditMaster 13. Designed to meet the need for data safety and compliance with privacy and accountability practices, AuditMaster fits seamlessly into your PSQL environment. It offers you the ability to implement the data monitoring solution you need without changes to your database or overlying applications.

AuditMaster is an offering in the PSQL product suite that extends data access security and accountability in PSQL systems without requiring code changes to your application.

Please review these release notes for last-minute information not included in the AuditMaster user documentation.

What's New in AuditMaster 13

AuditMaster has been updated to provide the following functionality:

- Support for newer versions of Microsoft Windows to match PSQL v13

Supported Operating Systems and Database Products

AuditMaster 13 is designed to work with the following operating systems and databases.

Operating Systems

AuditMaster is supported on the same Microsoft Windows platforms as PSQL v13 Server and PSQL Vx Server 13. For a list of these operating systems, see the PSQL v13 release notes at the [Actian website](#).

Database Products

AuditMaster 13 is supported on the following PSQL database products.

*AuditMaster 13 installs utilities only if a PSQL Client installed.

Other Requirements

You must have PSQL v13 installed on the system where you use AuditMaster 13.

The 32-bit AuditMaster 13 installer SetupAuditMaster32_x86.exe is not supported on 64-bit Windows.

To use AuditMaster 13 in IPv6 environments, you must apply the latest patch of PSQL v13 or PSQL Vx Server 13.

AuditMaster 13 does not currently support monitoring of data in Unicode formats.

We do not recommend running PSQL Defragmenter or Backup Agent at the same time as AuditMaster. Concurrent execution of these features and products may lead to engine errors.

Unsupported Features

The following functionality is not supported in this release:

- Version 2 metadata
- Unicode data types NCHAR, NLONGVARCHAR, and NVARCHAR
- Use of machine names containing non-English characters
- Use of 32-bit PSQL Server on a 64-bit operating system

Installation Notes

- You must have Administrator rights to install this product.
- To run AuditMaster under PSQL database security, see the user documentation for instructions.
- Before starting installation, disable antivirus and antispysware applications. You may reenble them immediately after installation. Antispysware can be left enabled, but be prepared when prompted to allow various installation tasks to execute.
- See the topic "Before You Begin" in the user's guide for more information about installing the product and about its hidden administrative share.
- The AuditMaster installer blocks installation on a system where DataExchange v12 is already installed because these two products have conflicting operations. If you need to install AuditMaster on a system that has DataExchange, you must first uninstall DataExchange.

Trial License Information

If you are installing AuditMaster on a trial basis without entering a license key, please read the following notes:

- After the trial period ends, AuditMaster will quit auditing the next time PSQL services restart. The AuditMaster status log also will display an entry noting that the license has expired and no auditing is occurring.
- You can verify your licenses using the PSQL Software License Administrator utility.
- If your AuditMaster license is valid, but your trial license for the database product expires, you will receive a number of different errors depending on what operation you are attempting in AuditMaster. For instance, the viewer may return an error saying that the database is unavailable. To continue using AuditMaster, contact your PSQL sales representative to purchase a permanent key for the database product. Apply the new key and restart the PSQL services.

Upgrade Notes

If you are upgrading from a previous AuditMaster version, you can carry forward audit records and settings to continue using your existing audit records and configuration settings in AuditMaster 13.

Upgrading from AuditMaster 8.10 or 7

If you upgrade from AuditMaster 8.10 or 7, use these steps to save records and settings for continued use:

- 1 Before running the AuditMaster 13 installer, do the following:
 - Create a folder in a backup location, such as %temp%\AM_Save.
 - Stop PSQL services.
 - Find the AuditMaster share location in your existing installation. The default is C:\Program Files\Pervasive Software\PSQL\Audit. **Note the share name for reuse in step 3.** From this directory, copy the following folders to the backup folder you created:
 - Arch
 - Comp
 - Data
 - Empty
 - Restart PSQL services.
- 2 In **Control Panel > Programs and Features**, uninstall AuditMaster. When you see the following prompt, select **Yes** to completely remove the program:


```
Do you want uninstall to clean up Pervasive AuditMaster data and configuration settings?
```

 This step is especially important for AuditMaster 7, since selecting No will later install AuditMaster 13 in the original AuditMaster 7 location, where the default was C:\Program Files\Pervasive Software\PSQL\Audit instead of the new location C:\Program Files (x86)\Actian\PSQL\Audit. Selecting **Yes** enables installation to the proper location because no previous installation is detected.
- 3 Install AuditMaster 13 using the steps under “Installing AuditMaster.” Be sure to use the **same share name** that was used in the installation of the previous AuditMaster version.
- 4 After installing, do the following:
 - Stop PSQL services.
 - Copy the four folders you saved in step [1](#) above to the new AuditMaster share location, overwriting existing folders and their contents. In AuditMaster 13 the 32-bit share location is C:\Program Files\Actian\PSQL\Audit and 64-bit is C:\Program Files (x86)\Actian\PSQL\Audit.
 - Restart PSQL services.

- 5 Start AM Viewer and confirm that the configuration settings from your previous installation are working as expected and that you can view the audit records. If so, then you can delete the folders in both the backup and the previous installation.

Upgrading from AuditMaster 13

If at some future time you upgrade from AuditMaster 13 to a later version, the installer will automatically carry forward records and settings for use in the new installation.
